
Dear Neenah,





The History. Prior to 1950, the site of 216 North Commercial Street was home to the Mayer family before it became the Block Filling Station. In 1959, the current structure was built as the Neenah showroom of Winnebagoland Motors. Automobiles were displayed to passersby behind all glass wall and under the dramatic wood ceiling. In 1968 Winnebagoland closed, and Hesser Oldsmobile moved in. In 1975 the entire building was converted to a dialysis clinic and the wood beams and ceiling were hidden above popcorn drop ceiling on top of exam rooms, offices and treatment areas.



Nestled in the heart of downtown Neenah lies a facility that has continued its commitment to perfecting everyday essentials like Scott bath tissue and Kleenex facial tissue for nearly a century. The Kimberly-Clark Experimental Mill (X-Mill) sits on the same land that was the birthplace of the multinational consumer products company in 1872.

Fifty-two years later, in 1924 – the same year Kleenex was launched – construction on the X-Mill site began. The facility opened its doors for operation the following year, launching a history of creativity, innovation, and perseverance that would forever remain important to Kimberly-Clark.

HOW IT WORKS

Depending on the product, it can take anywhere between two to five years to be perfected by the X-Mill team. These years consist of extensive research, multiple product tests and trial runs, as well as modifications necessary to complete before products reach the store and consumer. However, no two products take the same journey through the process.

The facility completes over 250 trials annually, supporting numerous Kimberly-Clark business units, and doing so successfully without injury for nearly 20 years and counting. The current team boasts over 600 years of cumulative experience.

"That's a key to our success: the longevity of our team, and the different experiences that they've seen," said Scott Nelson, research and engineering senior manager. "They're able to translate that into support and make each research trial a success at the mill."

The collaboration between the facility's researchers and the machine operators is also critical for a project's overall



success. X-Mill team members often tap into their creativity and are constantly required to think outside the box during trials – focusing on improving products for consumers while providing the brands with the support needed throughout the entire trial process. As a result of this commitment, many of the machine operators from the site are listed on product patents that resulted from their dedication.

Change is constant at the X-Mill, and this year they're making another important one: installing solar panels to the roof of the facility,






