
count myself lucky to have gotten to know many of the people that make up this unequaled place.




got the warm and cold weather sports covered with golf in the summer and skiing and snowmobiling in the winter.

his is the story behind why several Neenah businesses named themselves what they did – the significance or the deep thoughts and reasoning behind why they

chose their business name. Some have personal meanings with a fascinating back story while others are quite simple or literal. Some names are just unique and evoke a natural curiosity to learn what they mean. Similar to naming a child, a business is your baby born of love and hard work! You name that 'child' after a beloved relative, a respected individual or something with a deep personal meaning in your life.

Red Door Mercantile owner Tina Palmer shared their name origin story, "It's a combination of reasons to arrive at the name. There was a great deal of thought that went into arriving at Red Door Mercantile. Mercantile means a general store. A place where you can find a variety of items. It also felt

cozy and welcoming. All very important to our experience. It's also a word that most people have heard which makes it approachable-also important to me. A red door has always been known through history as being welcoming and safe. An invitation from the inhabitants to come in. Love that! Those meanings encompass how we want people to feel

about coming to the shop. My mom's favorite perfume was Red Door. She passed away before we brought the shop to fruition - so that was just a confirmation on the name for me, a way for me to bring her into it as well."

Twenty four years ago, Cedar Bar and Grill was reaching a deadline to form their LLP. Sisters Kristen and Gretchen wanted a cool and catchy name, so they did some extensive research. As the deadline loomed closer, there was still no name in sight. Inside the building,

the former owner had patched a wall and the finished area looked like - cedar! Their logo depicting 2 mugs coming together is the creation of friendships.

David Earle tells the story of Cranky Pat's. He is a secondgeneration owner; his dad was Pat Earle. He and Frank (Frank & Pat's Pizza) were partners from 1955 to 1977. In 1977, they split the restaurants - Neenah, Appleton and Green Bay. Frank kept Appleton and changed the name to Franks but Pat

remove the word Frank from their Neenah location name. A courthouse call between brothers landed on Cranky Pat's! The name Cranky Pat's had the same cadence as Frank and Pat's. Also, the logo is a caricature of their father, and well, old men can be cranky!

A few years before **Lion's Tail Brewing Co.** founder Alex Wenzel knew he wanted to open a brewery in Downtown



Neenah, he knew he wanted to get a tattoo. The inspiration for his ink design came partly from home brewing- a hobby he had recently turned into an obsession, and partly from the genealogy of his family name. With a little research, Alex discovered that "Wenzel" is German descent of King

Wenceslas II, a patron saint of brewers, who started a brewing revolution in the 1200's by persuading the Pope to revoke a long-standing ban and allow his Czech people to brew beer. Centuries later the Czech people still consume the most beer per Capita in the world, and brew some of the best

beers in the world. Honoring that family history, Wenzel tattooed a family crest on his forearm of a two-tailed rampant lion (a Czech national symbol). He replaced the lion's tails with two stalks of barleythe chief ingredient in beer. Then in 2015 Alex and his wife Kristin decided to take the leap and build their brewery - but struggled to find a fitting name. Eventually they realized their family symbol (with the unique Lion's Tail) was a perfect way to represent their vision of combining new beer styles and creative twists with traditional old-world classics.

When you look up the word plexus in the dictionary, you'll find two definitions: (1) a network of nerves or vessels in the



body and (2) an intricate network. It was these definitions that caught the eye of Peter Strandwitz. Peter, along with the other founding members of Plexus Corp., was looking for a name that represented the vision that they had for the company – a company that was fully integrated, bringing engineering and manufacturing teams together to truly solve the needs of customers. Plexus symbolized this vision and proudly carries it on today. Plexus Corp. has grown significantly since founding in 1979; however, the global team of 19,000+ team members remain fully integrated, operating as One Plexus - just as their founders intended.

Xe54 (pronounced Zee Fifty-four)

was selected based on uniqueness. After owner Pamela Barnes mentioned to a friend that she wanted to incorporate less frequently used letters like Q, X or Z, he suggested Xe54; spelled with an X but pronounced Z. Xe54 is the symbol for the element Xenon and the periodic



table became a fun concept to incorporate. Adding the tagline 'a Wine & Cocktail Lounge' was a way to express who they are and what you can expect. Continued on next page

Salon di Amici literally means "Salon of Friends" and was inspired by their long-term relationships with their clients.

Alta Resources original company name was Ameritel. Jim Bere sold the company to Matrix Marketing in the early 1990s. When he sold the company, he held on



to the legal name "Ameritel" for a period of four years while the non-compete agreement was honored. In 1995, he started a new company and again, used the name Ameritel which was

instrumental in the successful new startup because of the brand identity it carried from before. After a couple years, it became apparent that this name was too narrow in scope and people felt it related to the telephone industry. So, with help from a consulting firm, the name Alta Resources was born. Alta gave the perception of "high", such as "high level of service". This was around 1997, and it has remained the name until today. About 2 years ago, Alta Resources refreshed the logo, but the name remains the same.

category. Originally FNDC, Future Neenah Development Corporation, we changed our name to Future Neenah in 1996. At that time, we underwent a strategic planning process to define our future, culminating with a new vision statement and change of name from FNDC to Future Neenah, Inc. In November 1981, 80 Neenah residents and businesspersons gathered to look at problems in Neenah and how they could be solved. The result was the creation of Future Neenah Development Corporation and the public / private partnership that worked toward central city revitalization. We're constantly looking forward to and planning for the future of our community!





Christmas music — featured a new community attraction that accentuated the holiday vibe.


Memories were made, and Community First was there as a sponsor with Future Neenah and by being part of bringing community-supported endeavors like The Plaza at Gateway Park to life.


